Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teacher will present the book “<i>12 Questions About the US Constitution</i>” on the Promethean Board using the GetEpic! App. • Teacher will read aloud and call on students to read aloud to the class. • Teacher and students will generate discussion about the topic. • Students will take a brief quiz on the book using the interactive Promethean board. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teacher will give instructions for writing a constitution • Teacher will demonstrate with a pre-made poster including a few items for a class constitution • Students will brainstorm as a class and add three more tenants to the class constitution • Teacher will use Promethean Board to display calligraphy samples • Students will be given materials and instructions • Students will create their own constitutions using artistic calligraphy 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teacher will divide students into groups of 2-4 • Teacher will issue each group a set of constitution-related math task cards • Students will work to solve the math problems (presented using facts from the U.S. Constitution) • The group with the most correct answers will win a prize. • Other groups will receive smaller prizes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teacher will define <i>parchment</i> with the class, and will discuss how parchment was formed in the past and why it was used • Teacher will use Promethean Board to display the term <i>Physical Change</i> • Students will define physical change as a class • Teacher will show brief video clips demonstrating physical changes • Teacher will give students instructions and a demonstration of distressing paper using tea • Students will distress their constitutions 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will watch the video “Understanding U.S. Constitution” parts one and two on the Promethean ActiveBoard. • Students will use iPads (with teacher using Promethean Board) to play Kahoot! to review everything they have learned about the constitution today.
